

From the Rector's Desk:

"Faith is that which, knowing the Lord's will, goes and does it; or, not knowing it, stands and waits, content in ignorance as in knowledge, because God wills; neither pressing into the hidden future, nor careless of the knowledge which opens the path of action. It is its noblest exercise to act with uncertainty of the result, when the duty itself is certain, or even when a course seems with strong probability to be duty." George MacDonald 1824-1905



MacDonald was a Scottish author, minister and mentor to Lewis Carroll and inspiration to C.S.Lewis.

He uses the word ignorance in the quote above but be not dismayed by it. He doesn't mean, I'm quite sure, not to try and learn, question and discover, but simply in those moments when we cannot discern a future, that we stand and remain constant. The noblest act occurs in uncertainty. We remain in an agile stance, nimble in Spirit, though our bodies age, while hound lives have much to learn. We approach the mystery that is faith on the balls of our feet.

MacDonald was a proponent of a loving God that would, in the end, redeem all things, this God, this Hound of Heaven. In our world of fractures and fault lines, the larger vision of the Perfect, ultimately dragging all wayward souls by way of an eternally loving Christ, to some vast realm of bliss, though not without some harrowing purification along the way, is salutary. I am motivated by love not fear. I wish to tell the story of Grace not to spare others some freakish weird alien idea of torment, but that that very Grace may more abound in accordance with the very prayer Jesus taught. Thy Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven.

It is well for our souls to have the promise of Grace for all people ready on our minds, so that our words will align with that meaning and our actions with thus be kinder, and of more infinite patience, as we wait with God for others to join us here and now. Can you catch this glimpse of faith that will brighten not just your life but strengthen others? Can you remember to be nimble even as the brittleness of our bodies tries to convince us to retreat into protection, or the overwhelming circumstances of life exasperate is to exhaustion? We can live in light. We can live lightly. We can touch gently. We can have faith. We can have faith even when we know not how.

Treasurer's Report

As of the end of December, our financial results for 2019 are as follows:

Church of the Holy Spirit finances were managed throughout 2019 under the leadership of the Finance Committee and Vestry. The members of the committee are Sally Bird, Gabrielle Bolarakis, Ed Filipski, John Higgins, Oscar Jones, Eva Lesniak, David Marlow, and Linda West. An internal audit of the books for 2017 and 2018 was conducted in December by Oscar Jones and David Marlow. Linda West volunteers by coming into the office weekly to enter items into QuickBooks and to cut checks. A special thank you goes to Oscar, who creates and manages our spreadsheets on a monthly basis.

In 2019, 66% of our revenue came from pledging parishioners, as well as regular givers. The rest was made up by our annual auction, Rectory rent, First Step rent, Meals on Wheels rent, seasonal offerings, plate and other smaller income. Our income total was over budget by about \$25,000 due to the service auction revenue and pledge donations coming in over budget.

On the expense side, many of these items are somewhat fixed. Our end of year expenses came in under budget by about \$3,000. We did use about \$12,000 of our savings account to finish the elevator, which was anticipated in 2018 after a final review of the project. Our end of year revenue over expenses was just under \$6,500 against a budget projected loss of just over \$22,500.

For 2020, our budget includes a deficit of just under \$11,000. Since our stewardship drive is being incorporated this year in the Epiphany visits, We Three Kings (W3K), we averaged the past three years' actual pledge amounts to arrive at the calculated number. After the final accounting is in, we most likely will need to adjust that line and will bring a revised budget to Vestry, if needed.

On the expense side of the budget for 2020, we have included no salary increases at this time due to the uncertainty of income totals. This may change after pledge numbers are in. We have increased our Fair Share in 2020 by 20%, up to \$30,000 to reflect our commitment to our Diocese.

We thank all of you for your support to CHS throughout the year by giving of your time, talent, and treasure.

The CHS Master Calendar was created to consolidate the multiple calendars that were being used previously. Not all those calendars were up to date; many did not have the same events listed. The ability to see details on the many events happening at CHS was not available on all the calendars.

Google calendar became the obvious choice: it allows us to access one site for all events, to manage those events in one place, including details as needed; embed the calendar on the CHS website; and allow for dynamic changes. A change made on the master immediately becomes visible on all linked versions. If a change is made to the master, it appears immediately on the web version and it will appear on your version as well.

You can access the CHS calendar from your computer, laptop, smart phone or tablet. To see the calendar on the website, go to www.churchholyspirit.org and scroll to the bottom of the page. Use the arrows below the header to see future or past months. Move to the far right and select if you wish to see a week or month at a time or click Agenda for a listing of events. Details are available for many events.

Eggzotic - A Celebration of Pysanky


