Treasurer's Report

As of the end of September our financial results for 2021 are as follows:

	YTD	Budget YTD
Operating Revenue	\$ 301,033	\$ 208,478

A couple of notes regarding our finances:

- Our revenue number includes the funds forgiven from our PPP loan #1 and PPP loan #2. The total is \$49,415. These funds are currently in our Church Money Market account and technically have already been allocated for salaries for past periods in 2020 and 2021. We understand that these funds will not need to be included in our calculations for determining our Fair Share (now called Marks of Mission) for the Diocese for 2022.
- The expense line does not include the cost of the kitchen renovation. Through several donations, our expense will most likely be around \$5,000, with an upgraded commercial kitchen as a result. Once all expenses have been calculated, the final expense will be reflected in our Church financials.
- We expect to be entertaining bids for the replacement of both air conditioners in the first quarter of 2022. These units service all of the building with the exception of the Parish Hall and First Step.

Thank you to all for your continued support of CHS. Many of you have also given of your time and talent. We are especially blessed at CHS during this unpredictable time.



Branch of Jesse





Jesse points to a new king in David's line. We know that this is fulfilled in Jesus, the King of Kings, who is a descendant of Jesse.

During the Advent season, a symbolic Branch of Jesse will decorate our Narthex. The Branch is a representation that connects God's faithfulness through the Old Testament to the newness in the form of the birth of Jesus. Just as God gave us the gift of life through Jesus Christ, we will share this hope with others in our community through the giving of Christmas gifts.

Like last year, in lieu of wrapped gifts, \$25 gift cards will be provided for our friends at Freedom House (a halfway house for men) and their Family Afterward program, Good News Home (a drug/alcohol abuse treatment center for women), Anderson House (a half-way house for women), Cristo Rey, and Binnacle House (a group home for boys ages 13-18). In order to provide these gift cards, we are asking for monetary donations only. With these funds, we will purchase the 125 gift cards and distribute them to the recipients. There will not be any specific gift item requests -- the decorative tags on the branch in the Narthex will simply provide donation instructions.

Monetary donations can be made via check, cash, or PayPal. Please note "Giving Branch" on the check or on the envelope if donating cash. There is a secure black box outside the Church office for anyone wanting to drop off, or it can be mailed to the Church. If donating through PayPal, please follow the link on the CHS website and note "Giving Branch" on the item ID or note line. Please note: if using the PayPal link, \$1.01 is added to each \$25 donation to cover PayPal's service fee (e.g., to make a donation for 2 gift cards, the charge will be \$52.02.)

Letters to the Women of Edna Mahan

AUGUST

I am writing this letter on my birthday. Reaching a milestone birthday has me thinking about what is important in life. Of course, at the top of my list are my wonderful wife and children. The Church of the Holy Spirit and the community I have found there have greatly enriched my life in large part because of our ministries at Edna Mahan. I have also thought a great deal about my faith in God that has never waivered over all the years of my life throughout all of the adversities and successes. I did not think that it was possible for that faith to become stronger, but then I started to volunteer at Edna Mahan and found in many of you such an awesome faith in God that my faith did indeed become deeper and stronger. In many ways my faith moved from my head to my heart. I miss our Shawl Ministry and Bible study sessions.

I want to share with you some quotations from Julian of Norwich. She was a mystic and theologian who lived a solitary life. She was born in the 14th century and died in the 15th century. She wrote the earliest surviving book written by a woman. I hope that you enjoy them.

"All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well"

"For we are so preciously loved by God that we cannot even comprehend it. No created being can ever know how much and how sweetly and tenderly God loves them. It is only with the help of his grace that we are able to persevere in spiritual contemplation with endless wonder at his high, surpassing, immeasurable love which our Lord in his goodness has for us."

"Christ revealed our frailty and our falling,

our trespasses and our humiliations.

he raises us in spirit

Vestry Elections

Mark your calendar for **Sunday January 23rd for the Annual Meeting**. In addition to reports by the various committees and missions, the is the time for the election of Vestry members. The Vestry is a group of church members committed to the well-being of the church and its mission. As a vestry member, you have the opportunity to discuss and plan the next program; to help support those programs already in place; approve the budget, oversee the way the finances are allocated, and help make decisions as to how we spend the funds we have received. Each Vestry member is expected to take responsibility for one, or more, of the programs which are planned. (This doesn't necessarily mean you do the work but rather make sure the program is implemented as planned.)

The term for new members is **three years**, during which time your area of responsibility may change. Current Vestry responsibilities include supporting care of church property; coordinating Formation; overseeing Fellowship events; and, arranging the monthly Vestry meetings.
