

In case of weather emergency-

1. Is there power at the church?
  - a. If yes go to question 2
  - b. If no- worship is should be cancelled/moved online
2. Is the heat and water functioning?
  - a. If yes then go to question 3
  - b. If no- worship should be moved online
3. Are the roads drivable?
  - a. If yes then go to question 4
  - b. If no then worship is should be cancelled/moved online
4. Is it still actively snowing/storming?
  - a. If yes then worship should be cancelled/moved online
  - b. If no then worship can be held
5. Is there a forecast for dangerous weather within 12 hours of a scheduled worship service or other church event?
  - a. Yes - if so what is the expected accumulation
    - i. Less than 2 inches- communicate to congregation to use best judgement regarding travel conditions and send links for zoom option.
    - ii. More than 2 inches - if possible decision should be made by vote of wardens/Rector/vestry then communicated, posted on website and social media at least 4 hours prior to event start (6 am for 10 am service) decisions regarding the 8 am service will be made by 8 pm Saturday evening.
  - b. No- why are you looking at this document then?
6. Does the priest have access remotely (meaning is there power and internet at the rectory in basking ridge)?
  - a. Yes then there will be morning prayer on zoom
  - b. If no then a lay leader may be asked to lead morning prayer on zoom
7. Does a tech team member or members have access remotely?
  - a. Yes then there will be morning prayer on zoom
  - b. If no then there will be no service that day.
8. If the decision is made in Saturday night that the 8 am service is cancelled, so will any meetings, forums, or classes that are scheduled between services
9. If the decision is made in Saturday night to go online it is possible that meetings, classes and forums will also be online.

The final decision will be at the discretion of the Rector, but she will ask for a vote from vestry members if time allows. Votes will be counted at 7:45 pm on Saturday or 6 am Sunday am

All of this is subject to change based on how emergency situations develop but this gives us a place to start.
